



GENERAL INFORMATION

History

The School of Medicine was created by the 61st Texas Legislature in May 1969 as a multi-campus regional institution with Lubbock serving as the administrative center.

The School has as its major objectives the provision of quality medical education and the development of programs to meet the health care needs of West Texas.

The School of Medicine is one of three schools of the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center. The two other schools are the School of Nursing and the School of Allied Health. These three schools are committed to regionalized, multi-campus educational and training experiences. The School of Medicine provides basic science courses at the Lubbock campus with clinical educational opportunities provided by faculty at the regional campuses.

The School of Medicine formally opened in August of 1972, 23 months from initiation of planning, with a freshman class of 36 and a junior class of 25 students. Currently, enrollment is at accredited capacity of 400, with 100 persons admitted to each first year class.

A member of the Association of American Medical Colleges, the School of Medicine is fully accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education. The School offers graduate training programs in 12 disciplines plus 1 transitional, approved by the Liaison Committee on Graduate Medical Education and the appropriate residency review committees. The School of Medicine awards Doctor of Medicine, and Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees in five basic sciences.

Regional Medical Education

Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Medicine is a regional medical school with emphasis on outreach programs in education and service. The School of Medicine was

created as a multi-campus regional institution to train and retain medical practitioners in the western part of the state and assist in providing health services for the 108 counties of West Texas. The result has been the development of a unique multi-campus program with regional centers in Amarillo, El Paso, Lubbock, and Odessa. The full time faculty of the School of Medicine is 295. In addition, there are 774 clinical volunteer faculty.

All medical students complete their freshman and sophomore preclinical studies in Lubbock, the central facility for the School of Medicine. For clinical studies, one-third of each class is assigned for the last two years to Amarillo, El Paso, or Lubbock. The campus at Odessa provides only graduate training at this point. Approximately two weeks before the first term begins, entering freshman are notified as to which Regional Academic Health Center they will be assigned during their junior and senior years. A randomized numbering system is used to select the campus assignment.

During the freshman year, an active orientation program familiarizes the student with the Amarillo, El Paso, and Lubbock areas and hospitals. The program includes trips to the Amarillo and El Paso regional campuses and visits with students located at those campuses to become acquainted with the area as well as the educational program. To allow flexibility in location assignment, a committee of students and faculty reviews all cases in which a student may wish to be reassigned to a particular campus.

At each regional center students rotate through the basic clinical clerkships in Medicine, Surgery, Obstetrics/Gynecology, Psychiatry, Pediatrics, and Family Practice with medical school faculty. They are provided a diversity of experience with additional teaching in community hospitals and in the School of Medicine's own

ambulatory clinics.

In Amarillo, clinical experiences are provided in area hospitals and health care facilities. These include High Plains Baptist Hospital, Don and Sybil Harrington Cancer Center, Northwest Texas Hospital, the Psychiatric Pavilion and Fillgore Children's Hospital, St. Anthony's Hospital, and the Veteran's Administration Hospital of Amarillo.

At El Paso, clinical experiences are provided at R.E. Thomason General Hospital, William Beaumont U.S. Army Medical Center, Hotel Dieu Hospital and Medical Center, and Sierra Medical Center

Hospital.

Lubbock offers clinical experience at Lubbock General Hospital, City-County Health Department Clinic, Methodist Hospital, St. Mary of the Plains Hospital and Veterans Administration Outpatient Clinic. In the senior year students may ake elective educational experiences at any of the campuses and/or at other institutions.

In the Odessa area, the School of Medicine provides clinical electives and medical education training portunities. The educational quality at regional center is comparable as medicated by uniform performance on measures such as National measures such as National measures and FLEX examinations.



Library

The Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center Library presently contains more than 145,000 total volumes and over 2,000 periodicals and subscriptions. Library services and collections are located on each of the four campuses: Amarillo, El Paso, Lubbock, and Odessa with Lubbock housing the major collections and serving as the administrative center.

The library is completely automated with a Library Information System (LIS) including on-line catalogs, circulation, Mini-Medline™, and other activities. Computerized search services with access to more than 50 data bases on a variety of health-related subjects are available. In addition, the teaching-learning center comprised of audio-visual materials, films, tapes and other non-book media assists students in the learning experience.

Students also have access to the Texas Tech University Library, which contains more than 1.5 million items including U.S. Government documents and substantial science holdings.



ADMISSION INFORMATION

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Medicine invites applications from qualified residents of the state of Texas and the neighboring counties of eastern New Mexico and southwestern Oklahoma which comprise the service area for the Texas Tech **Iniversity** Health Sciences Center School of Medicine. The Admissions Committee carefully reviews the applications of all adividuals meeting entrance requirements to select those 100 students whom the committee feels will make the best hysicians. Although evidence of high intellectual ability and a record of strong academic achievement are essential for success in the study of medicine, the admissions committee recognizes these are not the only qualities necessary for development of a physician. Compasmotivation, the ability to communieffectively with people, maturity and sessonal integrity are additional qualities the Admissions Committee considmportant. There is no discrimination on the basis of race, sex, ethnic origin, en age or handicap.

Undergraduate Course Requirements

90 semester hours (or equivalent hours) of work in a fully dited United States or Canadian or university by the time of the baccalaureate degree is highly desirable. Proficiency in verbal and written communication is assumed. A basic course in biostatistics and a basic knowledge of educational Spanish are recommended.

Medical College Admission Test (MCAT)

Completion of the Medical College Admissions Test is a requirement for admission. The Admissions Committee recommends that the test be taken in the spring of the year in which application will be made. Registration information may be obtained from:

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications will be **available** beginning **April 1st** of the year of application. Completed applications and all supporting documents must be postmarked by **November 1st**. Each application must be accompanied by an **application fee of \$30**. Where financial need is present, a

student may request waiver of the

application fee.

Each completed application will be reviewed by the Admissions Committee and personal interviews will be offered to those students deemed competitive for admission. All interviews are conducted at the Lubbock campus. On the day of interview, applicants will have the opportunity to tour the medical school, talk to medical students, and sit in on classes if they so desire.

Acceptance letters are sent on the 15th of each month beginning in November. When an applicant is offered a place in the class he/she has two weeks in which to accept or decline the offer. A deposit of \$100 is required to hold a place in the class. This money is refundable until June 15th of the year in which the student will matriculate. After that date the deposit will **not** be refunded even if the student does not matriculate at TTUSM. The deposit will be applied to tuition for students who do matriculate. By June 15th of each year all applicants will have a final decision on their application—accepted, waiting list, or

Early Decision Plan (EDP)

The School of Medicine participates in an Early Decision Plan whereby exceptionally well qualified applicants can receive a decision on their application by October 1st. Applications from individuals participating in the EDP must be completed by August 1st. Participation in this plan necessitates a commitment to apply only to the School of Medicine prior to October 1st and a commitment to attend the School if accepted. EDP

applicants will be notified of the decision on their application by October 1st. Individuals not accepted under the EDP will have their applications placed in the regular applicant pool **without** having to reapply and may apply to other medical schools.

Applicants for Advanced Standing

The School of Medicine accepts applicants to advanced standing on a competitive basis when positions are available. Only students who have been enrolled in fully accredited United States medical schools will be considered. Applicants for advanced standing must meet the same residency requirements as candidates for first year positions. A student who has been dismissed from, or withdrawn from, medical school will not be considered for admission to advanced standing unless the medical school in which enrollment originally occurred indicates that the applicant is eligible to return to that school. Applicants from related fields such as dentistry, or those who have taken basic science as a graduate student will be considered on an individual basis, but may be required to apply as a first year student regardless of the degree held.

Applications for advanced standing will be available after January 1st. The deadline for return of all application documents is April 15th. Interviews will be conducted only by invitation. A decision on all applications will normally be made by June 1st. The final decision as to the year in which an applicant for advanced standing is admitted and the assignment to a clinical campus is at the discretion of the Office

of Academic Affairs.

STUDENT LIFE

STUDENT GOVERNMENT

The constitution and by-laws for a student government organization were developed by students and faculty and were adopted in August, 1984. Each class is represented by its President, Vice-President and two elected members to the governing body which acts as the voice of the students to the Dean and to the faculty. The president of the student government appoints students to the standing faculty committees and serves as the interface with the administration. The President, Vice-President, and one elected member serve as the student representatives to the Honor Council. The three Vice-Presidents of the junior class at Amarillo, Lubbock, and El Paso serve as the student representatives to the committee which sets priorities for hardship transfer of campus assignment. The Finance Committee of the student government hears budget requests for all approved student organizations and allocates available resources among those groups. Student government is staffed by the Office of Student Affairs and the Associate Dean serves as advisor to the group.

CODE OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

By registration in the School of Medicine each student automatically subscribes to the Code of Professional Conduct developed conjointly by students and faculty and adopted in January, 1985. The code is compatible with that of the University, but is expressly designed for the School of Medicine. The purpose of the Code of Professional Conduct is to emphasize in the medical school environment the qualities of integrity, selfdiscipline, and professional behavior that are essential to all physicians. Possible infractions of the code are initially reported to, and investigated by, the Associate Dean for Student Affairs in conjunction with one student and one faculty representative. If there is indication of infraction, the student is notified in writing of the charge and the case is heard by a committee of students and faculty. The accused student has the right appear before the committee to present his own case. In the event the committee finds the student guilty of the charge, it makes a recommendation for sanction to the Dean. The Dean, as chief academic officer, has final decision regarding disposition. Sanctions may range from written reprimand to dismissal from school. The Code includes a formal appeals process, a process for dealing with emotionally disturbed students, and the modes for obtaining leaves of absence. Copies of the Code of Professional Conduct are given to each student at registration and are available in the Office of Student Affairs.

ORGANIZATIONS

The following state and national organizations are available to medical students: Texas Medical Association, American Medical Student Association, Student National Medical Association, Organization of Student Representatives, American Medical Women's Association, and Texas Association of Mexican American Medical Students. Local organizations include the Family Practice Student Association, Christian Medical Society, and Pediatric Club.

Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Medicine has the Zeta chapter of Alpha Omega Alpha to which qualified students are elected in their junior or senior year.

RECREATION AND ENTERTAINMENT

In Lubbock, TTUHSC is on the campus of Texas Tech University, affording students easy access to campus recreational and entertainment facilities at student rates. The music and drama departments maintain an active calendar of events. The Department of Recreational

sports offers various facilities and programs to suit almost every individual need: indoor/outdoor swimming, outdoor equipment rental, lighted tennis courts, lighted playfields and numerous apportunities within the Student Recreation Center such as gymnasium areas, handball/racquetball, weight training, andoor jogging, audio-visual entertainment and projects, and free clinics and classes. Programs include intramurals, acquatics, sports clubs and outdoor afternure.

At Amarillo, students have access to the exceptional facilities at Amarillo College and at West Texas State University in near-canyon. The campus is near Palo Duro State Park.

In El Paso students are eligible for membership in the recreational program the University of Texas in El Paso.

The Project to Revise the Education Program (GPEP) was begun in January, 1985, after one of background preparation. Three major committees will take up to two to revise appropriately the underrequirements and admission to modify and integrate the curriculum as that approach to modem-solving and to personal growth enhanced; and to develop appropriate modes for student and for

faculty. Recommendations from the study groups will be presented to faculty and the current curriculum will be revised or modified during the next two years.

CURRICULUM

Pending completion of the PREP recommendations, the first year curriculum provides background in the areas of anatomy, biochemistry, neurosciences, and physiology. This serves as preparation for the second year curriculum which builds upon and integrates this knowledge in the areas of microbiology, pathology, pharmacology, and introduction to clinical medicine.

The third year is characterized by several changes in the educational format. First, the setting is changed from one in which all students learn several disciplines simultaneously to a division of the class into groups which study different medical disciplines at any point in time. Secondly, students focus all of their attention on only one discipline at a time e.g., pediatrics, surgery, etc. Thirdly, two-thirds of the class relocate from the Lubbock campus to either the Amarillo campus or the El Paso campus.

The senior year provides for experience in family medicine, both in a clerkship setting at the School of Medicine and in a preceptorship setting with a practicing community physician. During this time the student also completes the Electives Program which serves several purposes. Not only does the student explore areas of personal interest in greater depth, but he/she has an opportunity to strengthen areas of academic weakness or to learn in settings which are potential sites for residency training.

GRADES

as a minimum in any course. Normal progress a curriculum requires a cighted average for each year passing in all pass/fail courses.

Work completed at another school may be transferred only with the approval of the respective department chairman and authorization by the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs. Credit for transferred work is recorded as "CR" (credit) and is not used in calculating the weighted grade average.

Grades submitted for clinical clerkship courses are also accompanied by narrative comments characterizing each student's clinical performance. These narrative comments are used by the Associate Dean for Student Affairs in providing residency programs with meaningful summaries of each student's attributes and abilities.

A CADEMIC ADVANCEMENT

The Grading and Promotions Committee is responsible for reviewing the records of each student in the medical curriculum. Satisfactory academic achievement is only one of several criteria used in judging the fitness of a student for the practice of medicine. Demonstration of clinical competence, professionalism in treating patients, and an appropriately balanced electives program are also required.

The Grading and Promotions Committee interviews all students who are under review for unsatisfactory performance and determines whether remedial study, repetition of the academic year or dismissal is required. Committee decisions may be appealed to the Dean only on the basis of a violation of due process.

The core courses of anatomy are designed specifically as the first anatomy teaching episode for the training of physicians and professional anatomists.

To accomplish this, the Department of Anatomy has structured its courses and teaching methods to fit the needs of today's professional. The course material is trimmed down to what directly applies to the training and practice of an academician. New teaching methods using audio-visual aids, special notes written by the instructors, lecture lattices and demonstrations increase the efficiency of laboratory time.


Thus, by careful incorporation of modern teaching methods, modern instruments, improved faculty contact and careful screening of course material, today's medical student can be taught the necessary material in a meaningful manner.



The prime objective of the Department of Internal Medicine is to develop in students the intellectual and physical mechanisms for the careful evaluation of the patient and the use of fundamental principles of the basic sciences in the rational study of the patient and his or her disease. This major aim translates into

a series of instructional objectives which include:

1. teaching of the careful elicitation of a history,

2. teaching of a thorough and orderly physical examination,

3. teaching of techniques of clinical problem solving through

a. didactic discussions of disease processes emphasizing fundamental mechanisms and natural history of the disease,

b. bedside discussion of patients and their problems and the means by which to help solve those problems.

Clinical teaching occurs in both inpatient and outpatient settings. Student activities are directed by salaried and volunteer members of the faculty and the activities of students are integrated as part of the patient care team. Teaching sessions are organized to guide the students reading in Internal Medicine and to correlate factual material with patient care problems.




Medical School Program: The Department of Microbiology offers a required comprehensive course in medical microbiology for second-year medical students. The course is divided into lecture, laboratory demonstrations, and clinical correlation conferences. The lectures provide information on the role of microorganisms in the production of disease. The clinical correlation conferences, given by members of the various clinical departments in the School of

Medicine show the relevance of microbiology in the practice of medicine. The laboratory demonstrations illustrate the processes used to diagnose disease in the clinical laboratory.

The interplay of the parasite (bacterial, mycotic and viral) and the host in the development and subsequent outcome of infectious diseases is the central theme of this course. A study of immune mechanisms and disorders of the immune system is integrated into the course.



Obstetrics and Gynecology deals with the woman as a primary care patient during her reproductive years and with those functional aberrations and diseases of the female generative tract occurring at any time during life. The course of study provides the student with a basic knowledge of the reproductive process and an understanding of the function of the female reproductive system, especially during pregnancy and childbirth. The student gains practical experience through the management of normal pregnancy, the evaluation of the status of

the fetus in utero, the supervision of labor, the conduct of delivery and management of complications.

Gynecology instruction focuses on presenting the basic principles of gynecologic examination and the diagnosis and therapy of diseases of the female reproductive system. This includes the physiology of menstruation, fertility, infertility and fertility regulation, as well as gynecological disease-cytology, oncology and pathology.





The course of study in the Department of Pediatrics provides each student with a closely supervised learning experience in the care of infants and children, both ill and well. Primary emphasis is placed on the practical application of basic science knowledge to the solution of clinical problems. Students observe and participate in diagnostic and patient care activities concerned with premature and term newborns, growth and developmental processes, infectious diseases, hema-

tology, pulmonology, adolescent medicine, developmental disabilities, endocrinology, allergy/immunology, cardiology, psychiatry, communicable diseases and problems of a nutritional or metabolic nature. There is emphasis on preventive as well as therapeutic medicine.

Electives for senior students are available in ambulatory/outreach pediatrics, developmental disabilities, endocrinology, cardiology, neonatology, pediatric neurology, medical virology and general pediatrics (at Lubbock); cardiology, hematology, infectious diseases, pulmonology and general pediatrics (at El Paso); and general pediatrics, endocrine/metabolic/genetic disorders, clinical pharmacology and neonatology (at Amarillo).

An elective course, introduction to well-baby care is available to freshman students. This provides an introduction to the care of infants as well as a broad overview of preventive pediatrics. Basic principles of physical diagnosis are taught during the sophomore year.

The psychiatry teaching program has two major objectives. The first is to prepare the student to deal with the human aspects of patient care. The patient's illness is influenced by a variety of psychological and social as well as piological factors, and the effective physician must understand them. Although medicine is a science, the practice of medicine is an art. Thus, one of the major goals of the course of instruction is to help the student gain a basic understanding of the factors which influence health and illness, and to be able to apply this knowledge in a skillful doctor-patient relationship.

The second major goal is to provide

the student with an understanding of the field of clinical psychiatry. This includes the etiology, manifestation and treatment of emotional disorders. The primary care physician is often the first to see psychiatrically ill patients and must be able to make evaluations and provide appropriate referrals or treatment.

The instructional approach uses lectures, videotapes, patient interviewing in small groups, and participation in the care of psychiatric patients in the clinical setting. Throughout, an attempt is made to help the student integrate the biological and psychosocial knowledge necessary to an understanding of contemporary psychiatry.

Required Courses


MPS 60452—Introduction of Psychiatry. This course includes an overview of normal emotional growth and development and the psychosocial aspects of illness, as well as an introduction to clinical psychopathology. Teaching methods include lectures, videotape presentations, seminars and actual patient

demonstrations. The course serves as a didactic base for the Psychiatric Interview Courses and the junior-level Psychiatric Clerkship.

MPS 60273—The Psychiatric Interview. The emphasis in this introductory course is the process of the psychiatric interview and its value as an information-gathering diagnostic, and therapeutic technique. A faculty member supervises each patient interview conducted in a small group setting. A discussion follows which focuses primarily on the conduct of the interview, the psychopathology observed and the diagnostic and therapeutic implications.

MPS 71257—Junior-Senior Clerkship. The clerkship provides a comprehensive experience in clinical psychiatry. The students are assigned to the psychiatry department inpatient, outpatient, consultation/liaison and alcohol treatment services, and participate in the admission, evaluation, diagnosis and treatment of psychiatric patients. Case conferences, at which the student is responsible for presenting a diagnostic formulation and treatment plan for his patients, are an integral part of the clerkship. The clinical work is supplemented by a series of didactic seminars.

A wide variety of electives are available during the I, III and IV years.



PREVENTIVE MEDICINE AND COMMUNITY HEALTH



Preventive Medicine is a specialized seld of medical practice composed of: general preventive medicine, occupatonal medicine, public health and aerospace medicine. The goal of this department is to provide a center of excellence in: clinical preventive medicine, environmental and occupational health, health care organization and administration, epidemiology and social and behavorial sciences.

The teaching objective is to explain the principles of preventive medicine and health care delivery, particularly as they relate to primary care in general. The service objective is to demonstrate the application of these principles in clinical settings. The research objective is to develop understandings which are basic to preventive medicine and community health.

Required Course

MPM 60201-Preventive Medicine and Community Health. This course introduces the principles and methods of clinical preventive medicine and of health care delivery.



RADIOLOGY

The Department of Radiology employs such modalities as x-radiation, computed tomography, nuclear medicine and ultrasound for the diagnosis of disease.

The department is actively engaged in undergraduate and postgraduate radiological education. Radiology faculty presentations are given in anatomy and are a regular part of the course in pathology. A 16-hour required course is given in the second year.

A one month elective is offered to the undergraduate medical students in their clinical years after the basic clinical rotation is completed. As a prerequisite, at least one rotation must have been taken in either internal medicine or surgery. The elective student will observe and participate in all phases of departmental activity including conferences and teaching file review.

The Department of Radiology includes the following major specialty areas:


- 1. General diagnostic radiology: diagnosis through interpretation of x-ray images.
- Computed tomography: cross-sectional imaging by means of x-ray scanning and computer reconstruction.
- 3. Neuroradiology: diagnosis of neurological disease with radiological techniques.
- 4. Angiography: diagnosis of cardiac and vascular abnormalities by catheterization and opacification of heart and vessels.
- Pediatric radiology: general diagnostic radiology as it is applied to the specific and unique aspects of the care of infants and children.
- 6. Nuclear medicine: the medical use of radionuclides for diagnostic imaging, functional studies, laboratory procedures and treatment.
- 7. Diagnostic ultrasound: an imaging modality which relies on reflected. inaudible sound waves to provide

diagnostic information.

 Radiobiology and radiation physics: part of the basic scientific background for the radiologist and those professionals who are concerned with protection of the public against ionizing radiation.

Instructional programs are designed to

acquaint the student with the clinical discipline of surgery and the principles and techniques used in management of surgical disease and injury.

The introduction to surgery provided in the junior clerkship reinforces an understanding of the pathophysiology of surgical disease, the techniques of arriving at judgmental decisions in management, pre- and post-operative care and emergency care. The student learns as a participating member of the surgical team. Teaching sessions include ward rounds, a lecture series, daily reviews of patients with a faculty member and attending conferences. Senior clerkships are provided in all surgical specialities as electives.

The graduate who demonstrates outstanding competence as a junior and senior clerk receives the Robert J. Salem Award for Excellence in Surgery.

Divisions within the department include:

Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery—This division provides a series of lectures on the fundamentals of cardiovascular and thoracic disease and management during the junior clerkship and a senior elective with the clerk functioning with a preceptor learning techniques of diagnosis and surgical management of congenital and acquired disease.

Emergency Medicine—This division provides instruction in patient management in a modern emergency center to junior and senior clerks in all medical and surgical disciplines.

Oncology—This division provides a senior elective which includes experience participating in the management of the cancer patient using a multimodal, multidisciplinary approach to the treatment of the disease.

Oral Surgery—This division provides education and patient care services on call.

Otorhinolaryngology—This division provides instruction to freshman, sophomores and juniors and a senior elective in the methodology of examination and use of otorhinolaryngological diagnostic instruments and management of disease and trauma.

Pediatric Surgery—This division provides a series of lectures to junior surgical clerks, residents and faculty on the management of surgical diseases of infants, children and adolescents and offers a senior elective.

Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery— This division presents principles of plastic and reconstructive surgery at the freshman and junior levels and offers senior elective experiences as preceptorships with faculty or at rotations, conferences and rounds of the trauma service unit.

Surgical Research Laboratories—This division facilitates basic and applied research by surgical faculty and offers research electives to senior medical students and residents. The lab assists in solving patient care problems arising on the surgical wards and seeks new and improved methods of patient manage-

ment.

Trauma and Burns—This division is concerned with the physiologic and metabolic response of the body to severe injury. Offerings include a senior elective on resuscitation, evaluation, triage and initial management of injured patients, and the supportive management of severely traumatized patients during the most acute phase of care. Service includes emergency department rotations, conferences and rounds of the trauma service unit.

Urology—This division offers lectures during the freshman and junior years and a senior elective including instruction in diagnostic steps, management of common urological disorders and basic pathological and abnormal physiological changes.


MGS 71827-MGS 71227-General Surgery. An introduction to the pathophysiology of surgical diseases and the principles and techniques used in their diagnosis and management. Course includes participation in pre- and post-operative patient care, operating room and clinic experience as a member of a team of the surgical faculty.



GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION

The School of Medicine of Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center (TTUHSC) is a regional medical school with clinical campuses at Amarillo, El Paso, Lubbock, and Odessa. TTUHSC has approved residencies in twelve disciplines plus one transitional postgraduate year. Programs in each center are virtually autonomous but may include rotations between centers to increase clinical experience. Residencies at all four centers are accredited through TTUHSC but based in primary teaching hospitals in each city. The primary teaching hospitals are the Northwest Texas Hospital (Amarillo), R. E. Thomason General Hospital (El Paso), Lubbock General Hospital (Lubbock), and Medical Center Hospital (Odessa). There are two Dean's Committee V.A. Centers at Amarillo and Big Spring. In addition, TTUHSC has affiliations with over 40 community facilities in West Texas.

All programs are approved by the Accreditation Council on Graduate Medical Education of the American Medical Association and the respective residency review committees.



CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION

The professional life of physicians should include activities which continuously update their knowledge and skills with the goal of improving the health

care status of the community.

The Office of Continuing Medical Education assists physicians in accomplishing this goal through the development of programs to increase medical knowledge and skill. The Office of CME coordinates programs, facilitates their presentation, and assists in their evaluation. The Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education has accredited the School of Medicine CME program enabling the office to sponsor conferences for Physician's Recognition Award (PRA) credit.

The CME staff recommends and supports new and innovative efforts in relevant areas to physicians practicing in the community and, in addition, provides leadership and liaison to School of Medicine departments. In the near future state-of-the-art communications networks and computer systems will enable the CME staff to tailor educational programs

for individualized needs.



GRADUATE PROGRAMS

Graduate programs in the basic medical sciences are an integral part of the mission of the School of Medicine. These programs use the research and clinical environment of the School of Medicine to prepare students to conduct research and to teach in their disciplines. Exceptional students may seek simultaneous enrollment in both the School of Medicine and the Graduate Program. An individualized program of study and research will be designed to permit the student to complete the requirements of both the M.D. degree and the Ph.D. degree in one of the approved graduate programs.

Graduate programs leading to the Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees are offered in Anatomy, Medical Biochemistry, Medical Microbiology, Pharmacology and Physiology. Individual departmental descriptions

can be found within this bulletin.

The master of science and doctor of philosophy degrees are conferred in recognition of the soundness of scholarship and research in the specific field of study. Evidence of attainment will be provided through comprehensive written and oral examinations and through the presentation of an acceptable thesis or dissertation based upon independent research.

The basic admission requirements include a bachelor's degree or the equivalent from an accredited college or university. An average of B and a score of 1100 on the combined verbal and quantitative portions on the Graduate Record Exam is generally required.

DEPARTMENT OF ANATOMY

This department offers study in the following graduate degree programs; ANATOMY, Master of Science, Doctor of

Philosophy.

The Department of Anatomy offers programs leading to the Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees in the anatomical sciences. The objective of this graduate training is to prepare superior students for careers in teaching and research in the biomedical sciences. The major areas of employment for anatomists are in medical and paramedical professional schools and research institutes.

The Department of Anatomy offers a program emphasizing well-rounded training in gross anatomy, histology and cell biology, developmental anatomy, and neuroscience. Specialized research training is offered in areas such as developmental biology, reproductive biology, neuroendocrinology, and mineralized tissue biology. Every effort is made to stress the relationships between structure and function.

Most graduate courses offered by the Department of Anatomy build on the knowledge a student has obtained by taking ANM 5310, 5311, 5611. Thus, for each course indicated by an asterisk below, the prerequisite is one or more of the above three courses or equivalent. Students wishing to register for any anatomy courses must have written permission from the chairperson or Director of Graduate Studies of the department.

COURSES IN ANATOMY. (ANM)

*5113, *5213, *5313.Selected Topics in Anatomy (1:1:0;2:2:0;3:3:0). Material may vary from semester to semester. May be repeated for credit if different topics are covered for each registration. *5303. Advanced Anatomical Studies (3:0:6). Advanced studies in surgical anatomy, gross anatomy, histology, embryology, neuroscience, or cell biology.

25305. Medical Cell Biology (3:3:0). An interdepartmental course for graduate students in the biomedical sciences. Emphasis on the medical aspects of cell structure and function, including analysis of recent concepts and current literature. Techniques and methods of cell biology will also be examined in the laboratory.

*5309. Biology of Reproduction (3:3:1). The various aspects of biological reproduction with an emphasis on human problems. The reproductive process will be taught from union of the gametes to the delivered fetus. Morphology will be stressed.

5310 Microanatomy of the Human Body (3:2:4). Prerequisite: Departmental approval. Correlation of the structural organization with functional specializations of human tissues and organs; clinical correlations are also an integral part.

(3:3:0). Prerequisite: Departmental approval. This course deals with the development of the human embryo from fertilization to parturition. Clinical correlations are strongly emphasized.

*5321. Advanced Gross Anatomy (3). An in-depth gross anatomical study devoted to one of the following areas of emphasis: topographical anatomy, head and neck, thorax and abdoman, pelvis and perineum, extremities and back, depending on the student's needs. The course may be repeated for credit if another area of emphasis is selected.

5330. Advanced Anatomy for Sports Medicine (3:2:2). Gross anatomy designed for sports medicine with emphasis on body parts most susceptible to athletic injuries.

*5410. Introduction to Research Methods in Anatomy (4:2:6). Introduction to research methods available within the department. Practical experience in microscopy and tissue preparation (light and electron microscopy) is gained through student projects. A journal club stresses analysis of experimental technique and design.

5611. Gross Anatomy (6:2:10). A highly integrated introductory course of anatomical study (including human prosection) which embodies the gross morphology of the body and coordinates it with the clinical, developmental, and microscopic aspects of the human body.

6000. Master's Thesis (VI-6).

7000. Research (VI-12).

7101. Anatomy Seminar (1:1:0). 8000. Doctor's Dissertation (VI-12).

DEPARTMENT OF BIOCHEMISTRY

Professor Kenneth L Barker, Chairman, Professors Behal, Everse, Leavitt, Morrow, and Shetlar; Associate Professors Faust, Garner, Holly, Hong, Little, Perez, Sridhara and Stocco; Assistant Professor Whelly; Adjunct Assistant Professor Fuller.

This department offers study in the following graduate degree programs: MEDICAL BIOCHEMISTRY, Master of Science, Doctor of Philosophy.

The programs are designed to prepare students for research and teaching careers in biochemistry as related to the medical and life sciences.

Major areas of current research in the department include studies of the regulation of gene expression in a variety of eukaryotic tissues, biochemistry of development, mechanisms of hormone action, biochemistry of neoplasia, genetics of somatic cells in culture, biochemists

istry of membranes, mechanisms of enzyme action, and recombinant DNA.

Admission to the Ph.D. program requires prior course work in mathematics, general physics, organic chemistry, analytical chemistry, and biological science. Students with deficiencies in any of these areas may be conditionally admitted pending successful completion of levelling courses prescribed by the department.

Students are required to take BCH 5921, 6337, 6521, 6522, 6523, and 6322 or their equivalents as determined by the department. In addition, students are required to take or to have successfully completed courses in physical chemistry, statistics, and computer programming.

Within 12 months after enrollment in the program, each student will take a preliminary examination in general biochemistry consisting of essay ques-

tions submitted by the faculty.

After a major portion of the required course work has been completed, the student must pass a qualifying examination which consists of two parts: a written portion in the form of an original research proposition designed to demonstrate the student's comprehension of some field of study related to biochemistry, ability to develop hypotheses, and competence in the design and conduct of promising and significant experiments; and an oral portion in which the student is expected to defend the proposition and demonstrate an understanding of the fundamental concepts and principles of biochemistry which relate to the proposi-

BCH 5921 is open only to students requiring this course as part of a regular graduate degree program, and enrollment requires the permission of both the department chairperson and the Associate Dean, Basic Sciences, Research and Graduate Affairs.

Information covering specific requirements for degree programs is contained in the departmental Graduate Student Handbook. Inquiries should be directed to the Chairperson, Department of Biochemistry, TTU Health Sciences Center.

COURSES IN BIOCHEMISTRY.(BCH)

5921. Biochemistry(9:5:2). Prerequisite: CHEM 3305, 3306 or equivalent. Human life processes at the molecular level with emphasis on biochemical homeostasis and control mechanisms.

6000. Master's Thesis (VI-6).

6101. Biochemistry Conference (1:1:0). Informal conferences between faculty and students considering topics of current interest in biochemistry not normally included in other courses. Literature search, evaluation, organization, writing, and oral presentation by the student are emphasized. Different topic each semester. May be repeated for credit.

6121. History of Biochemistry (1:1:0). Highlights in the advancement of biochemical knowledge will be

discussed.

6127. Seminar in Cell Biology (1:1:0).
Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.
May be repeated. Presentation of
current research topics in the
genetics and molecular biology of
eukaryotic cells, and related areas:
onocogenesis, differentiation, ageing.

6135, 6235, 6335, 6535. Topics in Biochemistry (1:1:0; 2:2:0; 3:3:0; 5:5:0). Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. Lectures in specific areas of biochemistry not normally included in other courses. May be repeated for credit with

change of content.

6320. Clinical Biochemistry (3:3:0). Prerequisite: BCH 5921, CHEM 4303, 4306, 4307, or equivalent. A study of clinical chemistry with emphasis on the interpretation of clinical laboratory data and concepts of laboratory-assisted diagnosis of human disease.

6321. Biophysical Characterization of Macromolecules (3:3:0). Prerequisite: BCH 5921, CHEM 4303, 4306, 4307, or equivalent and consent of instructor. A study of the major techniques used in the biochemical laboratory for the biophysical characterization of macromolecules.

6322. Biomedical Radioisotope Techniques (3:3:0). Prerequisite: BCH 5921, CHEM 4303, 4306, 4307, or equivalent. Basic radioisotope techniques as used in biomedical research with special emphasis on liquid scintillation counting techniques.

6326. Advanced Human Genetics (3:3:0). Prerequisite: A course in genetics and consent of instructor. Detailed consideration of population genetics, cytogenetic, molecular biology, and biochemistry as related to human heredity.

6337. Mechanisms of Enzyme Action (3:3:0). Prerequisite: BCH 5921 or equivalent. A study of the principles of catalysis and their applications in enzyme-catalyzed reactions. Topics are selected specifically to meet the needs of students in medical biochemistry.

6521. Human Intermediary Metabolism and Its Regulation (5:5:0). Prerequisite: BCH 5921, CHEM 4303, 4306, 4307, or equivalent. Consideration of normal and abnormal human intermediary metabolism with major emphasis on biosynthetic and catabolic pathways and on modulation and control.

6522. Molecular Biology of Eukaryotes (5:5:0). Prerequisite: BCH 5921 or equivalent and consent of instructor. An in-depth study of current knowledge of macromolecular biosynthesis and its control in eukaryotes. 6523. Regulatory Mechanisms in Biochemistry (5:5:0). Prerequisite: BCH 5921 or equivalent and consent of instructor. A study of current knowledge of molecular mechanisms for the regulation of cellular processes, including both endocrine and nonendocrine mechanisms.

7101. Biochemistry Seminar (1).

DEPARTMENT OF MICROBIOLOGY

This department offers study in the following graduate degree programs: MEDICAL MICROBIOLOGY, Master of Science, Doctor of Philosophy. The course work and information presented below describe those aspects of the programs of particular interest to students choosing to study and conduct research in the areas of medical microbiology which are traditionally found in the medical center.

Students seeking information concerning admission to the graduate program in medical microbiology, training and research opportunities, or teaching and research assistantships in the Department of Microbiology should contact the chairperson of the department.

COURSES IN MICROBIOLOGY. (MIB)

5181, 5281. Selected Topics in Microbiology (1:1:0;2:2:0).

 Selected Topics in Microbiology (3:3:0).

6000. Master's Thesis (VI-6).

6321. Tumor Immunology (3:3:0). Prerequisite: Introductory courses in biochemistry, microbiology, pathology, and immunology, or consent of instructor. The various



immunological, biochemical, and pathological parameters of tumor growth, both in animal model systems and in man will be presented. Emphasis will be placed on current concepts of tumor immunity, autoimmunity; immunological tolerance, surveillance, and enhancement; as well as on viral induced immunosuppression.

Viral Oncology (3:3:0). Prerequisite: Introductory courses in microbiology, immunology, and virology or consent of instructor. Introduces the concept of a viral etiology of cancer through an examination of the effects of oncogenic viruses on intact animals as well as isolated cells in vitro.

Topics in Bacterial Genetics (3:3:0). Prerequisite: General microbiology, microbial genetics, or equivalent, and consent of instructor. Lectures, demonstrations, and review of literature on inheritance in bacteria and their viruses with emphasis on aspects relevant to infectious diseases.

The Molecular Biology of Microorganisms (3:3:0). Lectures and discussions illustrating how modern techniques of genetics and biochemistry are being used to

elucidate the structure and function of DNA, RNA, and protein in procaryotic cells. Courses in biochemistry and microbial genetics are suggested but not required.

6325. The Biology of Animal Viruses (3:2:1). Prerequisite: General biochemistry and general microbiology. Lectures and laboratory work illustrating viral infection and replication within the affected cell. The interaction at the cellular level between virus and host.

6326. Medical Virology (3:3:0). Prerequisite: MIB 6325 or equivalent. A study by lectures and discussions of the pathogenesis of viral diseases of man. The course treats viral infections at the level of the metazoan organisms, with chemotherapy and/or prophylaxis where indicated.

6327. Molecular Biology of Procaryotic Membranes (3:3:0). Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. The molecular organization of procaryotic membranes with emphasis on the correlation between structure and function of biological membranes.

6329. Structural Concepts in Immunology (3:3:0). Prerequisite: Elementary knowledge of the immune system and biochemical properties of proteins. Designed to

consider the chemical nature of molecules involved in the immune reaction and the relationship between their structure and function.

6330 Cellular Mechanisms of the Immune Response (3:3:0). Prerequisite: General immunology or pathogenic microbiology or consent of instructor. Topics will cover the broad spectrum of present day knowledge of immunobiology. Contents of the course will explore ontogeny of the immune response, characterization of lymphocyte populations, induction and regulation of immunity and genetics of the immune response.

6331. Current Concepts of Genetic Engineering (3:3:0). Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. A course designed to consider methods currently available for cloning of genetic elements, the regulations governing their study, and impli-

cations for future research.

6332. Advances in Microbiology and Immunology (3:3:0). Prerequisite: MIB 6631 or equivalent. An advanced discussion of medical microbiology and immunology with emphasis placed on areas in which progress is currently being made at a rapid rate.

6335. Host, Microbe Interactions (3:3:0).
Prerequisite: Medical or pathogenic microbiology or consent of instructor. A study of the interactions between microorganisms and human and animal hosts.

6337. Medical Mycology for Graduate Students (3:2:3). Prerequisite: Two semesters of microbiology or consent of instructor. Course is concerned with medically important fungi and the mycoses caused by these organisms. Iaboratory sessions will emphasize identification methods.

6631. Medical Microbiology (6:5:3). A study of the role and place of bacteria fungi and viruses in human infectious disease processes, with emphasis on the interplay of the host and parasite relationships.

7101. Microbiology Seminar (1:1:0), 8000. Doctor's Dissertation (VI-12).

DEPARTMENT OF PHARMACOLOGY

Professor Alexander D. Kenny,

Chairperson.

Professors Lombardini, Pang, Pirch, and Potter; Associate Professors Carroll and Tenner; Assistant Professor Lyness.

This department offers study in the following graduate degree programs: PHARMACOLOGY, Master of Science, Doctor of Philosophy. The objective is to prepare students for careers in research and teaching. The faculty of the program seeks to foster a creative and productive research atmosphere, to provide encouragement and positive challenge, and to equip students with the intellectual tools they will need to be good teachers and investigators. Specialized research training is available in the areas of biochemical pharmacology and drug metabolism, endocrine pharmacology, calcium homeostasis, renal pharmacology, autonomic pharmacology, cardiovascular pharmacology, comparative pharmacology, psychopharmacology, and neuropharmacology.

COURSES IN PHARMACOLOGY. (PHIM)

5101, 5201, 5301. Topics in Pharmacology (1:1:0,2:2:0,3:3:0). Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. Specific areas of pharmacology not normally included in other courses. May be repeated for credit with change in content.

5130. Clinical Pharmacology (1:0:1). Prerequisite: PHM 5613. Participation in clinical rounds in a medical or surgical specialty in order to observe and critically discuss the therapeutic regimens being used in the treatment of specific diseases. May be repeated for credit with change in content. Teaching of Pharmacology (1:0:3).

5132. Teaching of Pharmacology (1:0:3).

Prerequisite: PHM 5613. Faculty supervised experience for advanced graduate students. Includes instruction in laboratories for medical and other Health Sciences Center students as well as lecturing in pharmacology courses designed for students with majors outside the department. May be repeated for pass/fail credit.

5228. Special Topics in Chemotherapy (2:2:0). Prerequisite: PHM 5613. Basic and current concepts concerning mechanisms of action, pharmokinetics, and therapeutic efficacies of antimicrobial and antineoplastic agents.

Comparative Pharmacology

5229.

(2:2:0). A study of drug action in nonhuman animals with special attention given to vertebrate and invertebrate animal models in pharmacological research. Discussion of plants and animals as sources of drugs and toxins.

5233. Advanced Topics in Neuropharmacology (2:2:0). Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. A structured indepth study of specific topics in neuropharmacology. Topics to be studied will vary each semester. The course will consist of lectures, discussions, and oral presentations of original papers by the class. May be repeated for pass/ fail credit with change in content.
5323. Pharmacodynamics (3:3:0). Pre-

Pharmacodynamics (3:3:0). Prerequisite: BCH 5921, PHY 5803, PHM 5613 or equivalent. Emphasizes the sites at which and the mechanisms by which drugs produce their biological effects. 5324. Pharmacokinetics (3:3:0). Prerequisite: PHM 5613 or equivalent. An advanced study of the principles and factors governing the access of a drug to its site of action. Such factors include the absorption, distribution, metabolism, and excretion as well as the influences of species, age, disease, and the interaction of other drugs.

Pharmacology of the Autonomic

5326. Pharmacology of the Autonomic Nervous System (3:3:0). Prerequisite: BCH 5921, PHY 5803, PHM 5613 or equivalent. A conceptual study of drugs which alter the function of the autonomic nervous system. Emphasis will be on mechanisms by which drugs affect transmitter synthesis, release, uptake, and metabolism as well as

5327. Neuropsychopharmacology (3:3:0). Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. A study of current biochemical, physiological, and behavioral evidence regarding mechanisms of action of the major classes of drugs which affect the central nervous system.

receptor function.

5330. Pharmacology in Sports Medicine (3:3:0). Prerequisite: Physiology and biochemistry or consent of instructor. Study of chemical substances used in sports with the deliberate intention of altering performance. Particular emphasis on stimulants, anabolic steriods, analgesics, anti-inflammatory agents, and anti-anxiety agents.

5334. Environmental and Industrial Toxicology (3:3:0). Prerequisite: College biology and organic chemistry or consent of instructor. A study of chemicals (food additives, pesticides, solvents, heavy metals, air pollutants), their biological effects, detection, and antidotes. Emphasis will be on the effects of industrial chemicals and their hazard to man, domestic

animals, and other living members of the environment. Techniques in Pharmacological Research (4:2:6). Prerequisite: BCH 5921, PHY 5803, or equivalent. A lecture and laboratory course designed to provide an

introduction to and hands-on experience with standard experimental techniques used in pharmacological research.

5613. Pharmacology (6:5:1). A study of pharmacology with emphasis on mechanisms of drug action, drug interactions, and therapeutics.

6000. Master's Thesis (VI-60.

7000. Research (VI-12).

Doctor's Dissertation (VI-12). 8000.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOLOGY

Professor Michael T. Kopetzky,

Chairman.

Professors Crass and McGrath; Associate Professors Davies, Heavner, Lutherer, Nathan, and Orem; Assistant Professors Janssen, McDonagh, H. Strahlendorf, and I. Strahlendorf.

This department offers study in the following graduate degree programs: PHYSIOLOGY, Master of Science, Doctor of Philosophy. Training in physiology is provided in the following fields: cardiovascular physiology, including autonomic receptors, hemodynamics, and metabolism; neurophysiology; respiratory physiology; body fluid physiology; endocrine physiology. Research is progressing in the department within each of these areas. The program is designed to train persons who will teach and conduct research in medical institutions.

COURSES IN PHYSIOLOGY. (PHY)

5304. Health Effects of Environmental Pollutants (3:3:0). Prerequisite: College biology and chemistry and consent of instructor. The physiological changes and potential health effects associated with energy usage and development.

Emphasis is on understanding mechanisms of actions, effects of extreme environmental and occupational conditions (i.e., altitude, temperature, pollution), and risk evalution. Offered even years only.

Advanced Physiology of Exercise 5305. (3:2:4). Prerequisite: P E 5308 or equivalent. Lecture and laboratory experience in the areas of cardiorespiratory, histochemical, biochemical, and environmental

considerations.

5402. General Physiology (4:4:0). Prerequisite: College biology and consent of instructor. An introduction to the physiology of mammalian organ systems placing emphasis on the human. Subject matter includes membrane transport, muscle, cardiovascular, respiratory, renal, water and electrolyte balance, gastrointestinal, and endocrine physiology as well as neurophysiology.

Physiology (8:7:4). A study in 5803. human physiology emphasizing body-controlling systems and their interrelationships. Pathological mechanisms are also stressed.

Master's Thesis (VI-6). 6000.

6300. Intermediate Physiology I (3:3:0). Prerequisite: PHY 5803 or equivalent. Intermediate level coverage of topics in neurophysiology with an introduction to the research literature. Prerequisite for advanced courses in the area.

Introduction to Physiological 6301. Research (3:0:9). Designed to initiate beginning graduate students in research approaches and techniques. Students may register for a maximum of three semesters in three different research laboratories. Research problems and methodology depend upon the work being conducted in the laboratory to which the student is



assigned. Students are expected to spend nine hours a week learning the use of instrumentation, surgical procedures, and analytical evaluation of data. Students receive 3 hours of pass/fail credit per semester.

6302.

Introduction to Physiology (3:2:3). Treats the areas of the historical evolution of physiological knowledge and its relationship to the history of science in general.

Intermediate Physiology III 6303. (3:3:0). PHY 5803 or equivalent. Intermediate level coverage of topics in gastrointestinal, metabolic, and endocrine physiology with an introduction to the research literature. Prerequisite for advanced courses in the area.

Advanced Physiology (3:3:0). This detailed consideration of physiological systems should be taken concurrently with PHY 5803.

Topics in Physiology (3:3:0). Each year, the department selects a topic and coordinates a Distinguished Lecturers in Physiology series. Five to seven invited speakers present seminars on specialized aspects of the selected topic. Between seminars, students examine materials in preparation for the upcoming seminar. 6311.

Neurophysiology (3:3:0). A study

of the physiology of nerve cells and their processes emphasizing excitability, conduction, and synaptic transmission. The major portion of the course is devoted to the physiology of neuronal systems, including mechanisms of sensory and motor system function, neurobiological rhythms, integration, and the role of the central nervous system.

6312. Experimental Neuroscience (3:1:2). Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. Students learn current techniques (e.g., anesthesia, decerebrate preparation, laminectomy, invertebrate preparation, and intracellular recording and staining) and study factors modify-

ing drug responses.

6313. Advanced Neurophysiology (3:3:0). Prerequisite; PHY 5803 or consent of instructor. An in-depth study of the nervous system from the molecular to the behavioral level, emphasizing electrophysiol-

ogy and reflexes.

6314. Membrane Biophysics (3:3:0). Prerequisite: PHY 5803, 6311, BME 6301, or consent of instructor. Current topics and techniques in the physiology of excitable membranes. Discussions cover the Hodgkin-Huxley papers and more recent theoretical approaches to excitation and conduction in nerve, skeletal muscle, and cardiac muscle. Students are introduced to such biophysical techniques as the voltage clamp, membrane noise analysis, lipid bilayers, and optical fluorescence. Offered even years only.

6315. Physiology of Neuroeffector Systems (3:3:0). A consideration of adrenergic, cholinergic, histaminic, and serotonin receptor systems and their physiological applications. Offered summers even years only.

6316. Topics on the Neurophysiology of Sleep (3:3:0). Possible topics include the neural physiology, phenonemology, physiology, and

pathologies of sleep.

6317. The Synaptic Organization of the Brain (3:3:0). Prerequisite: PHY 6311 or equivalent. A multidisciplinary approach to structure function relations of synapses in different portions of the mammalian brain: neurochemical and biophysical findings are combined with a study of junctional organization to facilitate the understanding of a functional pattern.

6319. The Physiology of Muscle (3:3:0). Prerequisite: PHY 5402 or 5803 or consent of instructor. An in-depth study of muscle physiology including structural, biochemical, electrical, and mechanical characteristics. Consideration will also be given to control mechanisms (neural, humoral, and myogenic) of skeletal, smooth, and cardiac muscle.

6321. Cardiodynamics (3:3:0), Prerequisite: PHY 5803 with at least a grade of B. Advanced physiology of the heart muscle and cardiac cycle.

6322. Physiological Chemistry of the Heart and Blood Vessels in Health and Disease. (3:3:0). Readings

and laboratory experiments directed toward understanding metabolic function and regulation of the heart and blood vessels in health and disease. Offered odd years only.

6323. Environmental Physiology (3:3:0). Prerequisite: College biology or chemistry and consent of instructor. Describes the physiological responses of mammals to environment alterations: hot and cold, hyper and hypobaric environments, hibernation, and gravity.

6328. Physiology of the Peripheral Circulation (3:3:0). Prerequisite: PHY 5803 or consent of instructor. Study of the peripheral circulation including: blood flow regulation, microvascular transport and exchange, special circulations (such as coronary and cerebral), and

vascular pathophysiology.

Prerequisite: Medical physiology or equivalent with consent of instructor. An in-depth course concerning all aspects of respiratory physiology with the exception of the regulation of respiration. Areas covered include mechanics of respiration, gas exchange, CSF acid-base balance, blood acid base balance, and oxygen and carbon dioxide transport. The comparative aspects of respiratory physiology are also addressed.

6332. Regulation of Respiration (3:3:0). An in-depth course concerning the chemical and neural regulation of respiration. Areas to be studied can include regulation of breathing during sleep, altitude acclimatization, and regulation of breathing during exercise.

6341. Renal Physiology (3:3:0). Recent advances in the normal and pathophysiological mechanisms of the kidney are discussed and correlated.

6351. Advanced Gastrointestinal Physiology (3:3:0). Readings and classical experiments related to the secretory and contractile functions of the gastrointestinal tract. Offered even years only.

6361. Advanced Endocrinology (3:3:0). Various endocrinopathies are discussed in terms of recent advances in the areas of assay of endocrine gland function, control of hormone secretion, actions of hormones, mechanisms of action, and the interrelationships among hormones.

6362. Endocrinology of Pregnancy (3:3:0). Topics pertain to the role of endocrine glands in the support of the fetus, the maternalfetal exchange, the development of endocrine function in the fetus, and the changes occuring at birth.

6500. Intermediate Physiology II (5:5:0).
Prerequisite: PHY 5803 or equivalent. Intermediate level coverage of topics in cardiovascular, renal, and respiratory physiology with an introduction to the research literature. Prerequisite for advanced courses in the area.

7000. Research (VI-12).

7101. Physiology Seminar (1:1:0). This weekly seminar series provides invited speakers from this and other departments as well as other universities and laboratories with the opportunity to present their current research in some area of physiology.

7102. Readings in Physiology (1). Students review literature on special topics of research. (Students may be assigned or may select these topics.) May be

repeated for credit.

7103. Supervised Teaching in Physiology (1:1:0). Prerequisite: PHY 5803. Supervised teaching experience including leading laboratory groups and small-group discussions and presenting lectures in some departmental courses (all under faculty supervision).

8000. Doctor's Dissertation (V-12).

OTHER COURSES IN THE HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER

In addition to the courses listed by department, the following courses are available in the areas indicated.

COURSES IN HEALTH COMMUNICATIONS, (HCOM)

5315. Health Communications Research (3:3:0). Critical examination and synthesis of past and ongoing research on the health communications process, focusing on mass communication research concerning health and medicine.

5319. Seminar in Current Topics of Information Sciences (3:3:0). This course will vary each semester emphasizing either information science topics or other topics in the health communications area.

5600. Health Communications Internship (6:4:0). Students will perform communication functions in health agencies for eight weeks under joint supervision of the chairperson of the student's advisory committee and an on-site supervisor.

COURSES IN HEALTH SCIENCES. (HS)

5310. Management of Sports Injuries and Illnesses (3:3:0). Preparticipation examination; types of injuries; diagnosis; early and late treatment of injuries; responsibilities of the physician, coach, trainer, and parent; and rehabilitation of the athlete.

5810. Integrated Neurosciences (8:7:1). This cooperative, interdepartmental effort offers a detailed study of the nervous system. Students examine both gross and fine structure from the subcellular



through the behavorial level.

COURSES IN PREVENTIVE MEDICINE. (PVM)

6302. Medical Entomology (3:3:0).

6303. Principles of Epidemiology (3:3:0). This course considers the variety, behavior, and distribution of both infectious and noninfectious diseases in populations. It will show how an understanding of the etiology, transmission, and pathogenesis of disease can lead to methods of disease prevention. Emphasis will be placed on the principles and methods of epidemiologic investigation.

6304. Topics in Community Health (3:3:0). This course will consider various topics in epidemiology, preventive medicine, and community health not normally included in other courses. May be repeated for credit with change in content.


