


Voice of Hope *Group 18*

- **₹**Population served: anyone affected by sexual violence in Lubbock and surrounding rural regions
 - Mostly 17 and under
 - 790% female but males tend to avoid reporting
- **→** Services provided:
 - **7**24/7 crisis hotline
 - Dispatch to ER to provide support for patient through exams
 - Law enforcement accompaniment
 - Counseling/case management
 - List of resources- assist with whatever they need (medicine, housing)
 - Will also respond to house calls

- **7**Clients' Health Needs
- Mental health
 - **₹**PTSD/Rape Trauma Syndrome
- Sexually transmitted diseases
- → Physical injuries
- → Pregnancy/family counseling
- **尽 Clients' Health Information**Needs
- **₹**STD education
- → Pregnancy and family planning
- → Resources available in community

- **Advice for Physicians**
- **₹**Lots of work done in the ER
- Watch your conversation carefully and keep in mind how difficult this is for a patient from this population
- Important to be involved with all agencies involved
