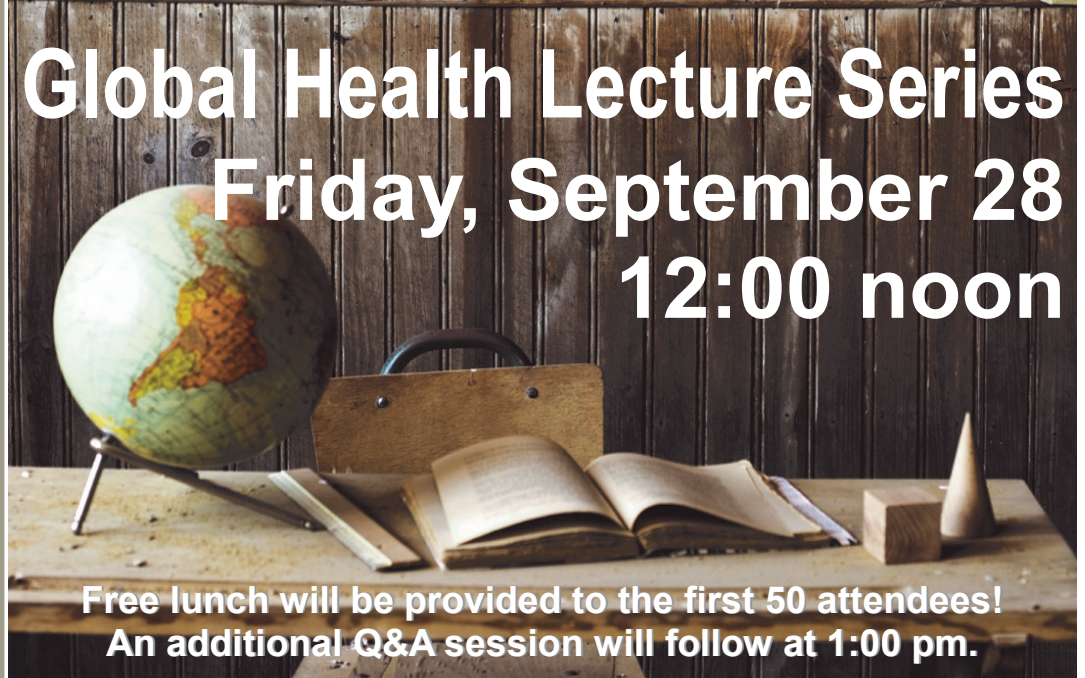

## ***Global Health in US Medical Education: A Focus on Israel & Palestine***

David McRay, MD directs the Israel/Palestine International Health Elective at John Peter Smith Hospital (JPS) in Fort Worth. This unique learning experience is available through the Rural and International Health Track at JPS, a program designed to expose residents and select medical students to various issues in international health.

Dr. McRay is a graduate of Northwestern University Medical School in Chicago, IL and the John Peter Smith Family Medicine Residency. He has traveled to Israel and Palestine on numerous occasions, beginning at the age of nine, and has lived in Jerusalem for extended periods of time on three occasions. He has lectured at the medical school in Beer Sheva, Israel and has participated in a variety of ways with the Palestinian Medical Relief Society (PMRS) and the Ramallah Emergency and Trauma Center (RETC.)

Prior to joining JPS, Dr. McRay served for 19 years in the Appalachian mountains of east Tennessee including as CEO and medical director of Day Spring Family Health Center, a non-profit community health center providing care to three underserved rural communities in Tennessee & Kentucky.
